School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Sequatchie County Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. SCMS values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that SCMS will support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Sequatchie County Middle School invites parents, teachers, and community members to family engagement meetings throughout the year to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, family input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through the family-friendly survey, which is distributed online and through paper copies. The plan is posted on our school website for families to review during the year and will be used to revise the plan for the next school year.

What is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Sequatchie County Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, foster, homeless, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student packet and given to all students. The plan is also posted on the school website and families can retrieve a copy of the plan in the school office.

What is Title I?

Sequatchie County Middle School is identified as a Title I Schoolwide School as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

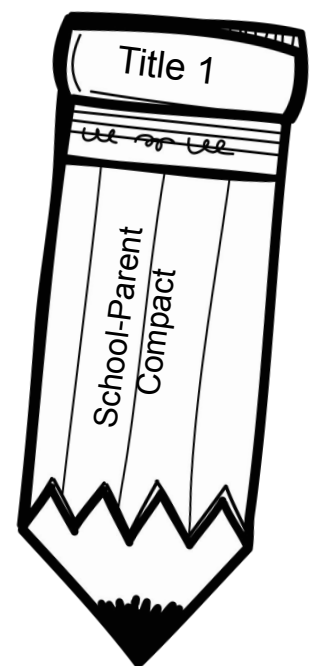
Parent and Family Engagement
